

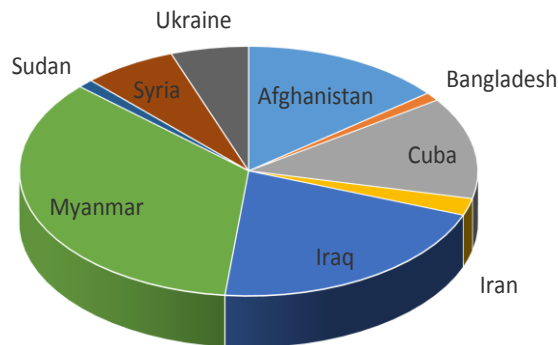
## Refugee Resettlement Program Fiscal Year 2015 Services

From October 2014 to September 2015, 91 refugee newcomers were resettled by Catholic Charities, Diocese of Camden's Refugee Resettlement Program. The program served over 350 refugee clients in all through a range of programs and services offered to all refugees in South Jersey (see list of services below).

Newly arriving refugees resettled by Catholic Charities came from nine countries of origin:
